California County Agricultural Commissioners (CACs)



**Local enforcement by 55
County Agricultural
Commissioners (280
biologists in the field)**

- 17,000 inspections per year statewide**
- Investigate reports of pesticide misuse, handler and fieldworker illnesses.**
- Implement state pesticide laws, regulations**

California County Agricultural Commissioners (CACs)



- Investigate public complaints including DPR complaint referrals from the CalEPA Single Complaint Tracking System**
- **1-87Pestline and mobile app**
 - **Take enforcement actions**
 - **Refer high level incident cases to local district attorneys or DPR**
 - **Consult with DPR on investigations and enforcement actions**

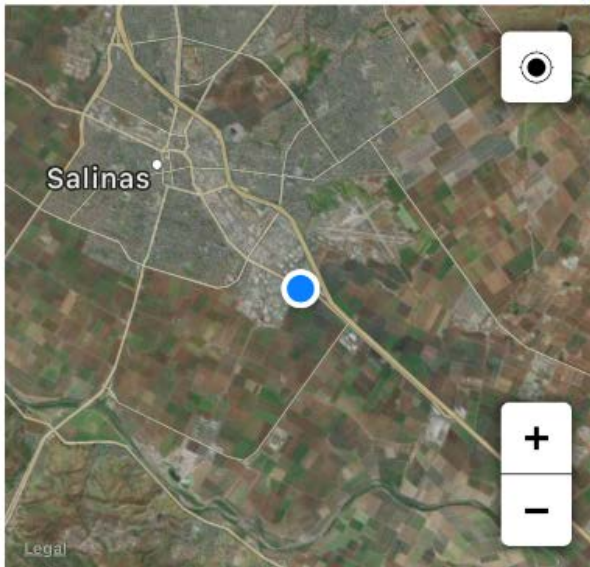
